MOORESVILLE REGULAR TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

Tuesday, July 21, 2026
6:00 p.m.
StageCoach Tavern

Attending: Mayor Nikki Sprader, Council members Kim Lindaman, Lara Brown, and Rush Mitchell
Absent: Margaret-Anne Crumlish and Kevin Crumlish

- The meeting was called to order with a quorum present.
- Council Member Lindaman made a motion to approve the June meeting minutes. Council Member Mitchell seconded, and the motion was approved unanimously.
- Mayor Sprader reported the America250 Celebration event was a tremendous success & stayed within budget. She commended Chairman Lara Brown and her committee. And, the Town has received 2 monetary donations in honor of America's 250th and as a thank you for the Council's efforts in celebration.
- Mayor Sprader reported that Representative Parker Moore will be delivering a \$5000 grant check soon.
- Mayor Sprader reported Huntsville Utilities will soon be performing maintenance on several of the fire hydrants throughout town. Hydrants were tested last week. Huntsville Utilities emphasized that they do everything possible to repair or upgrade the internal components of a hydrant before considering a full replacement, which requires excavating the existing hydrant. Top priority is ensuring the Town has fully functioning hydrants for fire protection. As a result, some hydrants may still need to be replaced. If a white "LOC" is painted on the road next to a hydrant, it indicates that Huntsville Utilities has identified it for replacement. Huntsville Utilities do everything possible to keep construction and repair work to a minimum and hopefully a small grass repair.
- Mayor Sprader reviewed the June 2026 financial report.
- Mayor Sprader reported that Creekside donated 100 chairs to the Town and they are stored in the Annex.
- Council Member Mitchell presented a plan to organize the Annex with shelving, lumber stands, and totes. Council Member Mitchell made a motion to spend up to \$800 to purchase materials as shown on the PO Annex Organizational Proposal. Council Member Brown seconded, and the motion was approved unanimously. (Plans are to survey the condition of the lumber stored in Annex in October/November timeframe to determine exactly what lumber storage is needed. Preliminary discussions with resident, Mike Sprader, lends to a lot of the lumber may not be usable; therefore, not needed to be stored)
- Mayor Sprader reported that Charter/Spectrum crews are actively installing fiber broadband lines throughout town. Once the construction phase is complete, Spectrum must complete additional software integration and customer service updates before our area is recognized as service-ready. That process typically takes a few weeks.
- Council Member Brown moved to adjourn. Council Member Lindaman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.
